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## **CALL FOR PARTICIPATION IN THE MOBILITY PROGRAMME - BIP (BLENDED INTENSIVE PROGRAMME) "INTERNATIONAL ARBITRATION MOOT" - ERASMUS+ PROGRAMME FOR STUDENTS OF THE MASTER'S DEGREE IN LAW, ENROLLED IN THE 3<sup>RD</sup>- 4<sup>TH</sup> AND 5<sup>TH</sup> YEAR DURING ACADEMIC YEAR 2024/2025**

### **1. PURPOSE**

The purpose of this call for applications is to define the conditions under which students of Università Europea di Roma may participate in the BIP (Blended Intensive Program) "International arbitration MOOT" mobility programme, which is among the novelties of the Erasmus+ Programme, with the aim of combining physical mobility with virtual and distance activities.

In this way, students from different European universities receive an educational experience through telematic collaboration between academic institutions, culminating in a short mobility at one of the partner universities.

This exchange will be carried out with the aim of academic recognition and achievement, as well as of matching the student's curricular profile.

Everything that is not regulated by these terms and conditions will be governed by the European provisions for the Erasmus+ Programme and the General Mobility Regulations of Università Europea di Roma.

### **2. ELIGIBILITY REQUIREMENTS**

The eligibility requirements for student mobility will be the following:

- Being enrolled in 3<sup>rd</sup>, 4<sup>th</sup> or 5<sup>th</sup> year of the Master's degree in Law at Università Europea di Roma, during the academic year 2024/2025
- Being a national of one of the countries participating in the Erasmus+ programme or be recognized by the country in which the student resides as a refugee, stateless person or permanent resident
- Proving knowledge of English at level B2 of the Common European Framework of Reference (CEFR)

#### **Former Erasmus+ students:**

They will not be able to exceed, once the duration of the physical stay requested in this call is added up, the maximum time of 24 months allowed by the Erasmus+ programme for the corresponding course of study that give access to doctoral studies (Law).

In case of tied score, applications received from students who have not been already assigned of an Erasmus+ study or internship mobility, will be given priority.

### **3. PLACES OFFERED AND DURATION PERIOD OF LENGTH**

**6 places** are offered to participate in the BIP (Blended Intensive Program) "International arbitration MOOT".

The structure of the programme is attached in Annex I of this call. It is integrated in the academic calendar 2024/2025 as follows:

- 12 weeks of online training between **January 10<sup>h</sup> and March 31<sup>st</sup> 2025**.
- 5 days of mobility for face-to-face training at the John Paul II Catholic University of Lublin (Poland) from April 21<sup>st</sup> to 25<sup>th</sup>, 2025.

#### **4. SUBMISSION OF APPLICATIONS**

Candidates must submit their application exclusively through the application form available on the UER website at <https://www.universitaeuropediroma.it/giurisprudenza/internazionale/> and submit it by **January 8<sup>th</sup> 2025**:

- a) by hand delivery to the International Relations Office (1st floor, room C108), during reception hours.
- b) by e-mail to [elena.lecci@unier.it](mailto:elena.lecci@unier.it).

The application must be accompanied by:

- a curriculum vitae
- a self-certification of enrolment with the updated status of student's career extracted from the Esse3 system: the list of taken examinations, relative marks and ECTS acquired
- copy of a valid identity document
- valid English B2 certification

Application received after the deadline, incomplete or incorrect, will not be taken into consideration.

The list of successful candidates will be evaluated by an appointed commission and published on the UER website within **January 10<sup>th</sup>, 2025**.

By January 17<sup>th</sup>, 2025 the successful candidates must send a statement confirming their participation in the BIP by e-mail to [elena.lecci@unier.it](mailto:elena.lecci@unier.it).

Candidates who do not wish to participate in the BIP project have to send an e-mail to the same address within the above-mentioned deadline.

#### **5. SELECTION CRITERIA AND RANKINGS**

Eligible applications will be evaluated according to the following criteria:

- up to 60/100 based on the sum of the weighted average and the percentage of the total credits accumulated in relation to the semester (obtained credits ÷ credits to be obtained, within the semester of reference for each student, x 30)
- up to 10/100 for the level of knowledge of the English language, awarded as follows: 3/100 for level B2, 6/100 for level C1, 10/100 for level C2.

#### **6. FINANCIAL ENDOWMENT**

The student applying to this call automatically applies for the individual support grant "Erasmus+ of the European Commission". For the mobility week for face-to-face training, participants will receive an individual support grant of €79 per day of stay and/or travel.

## 7. PRE-DEPARTURE MEETING

The acceptance of the assigned Erasmus+ mobility place implies the commitment of the student to compulsorily attend the pre-departure meeting to be held at Università Europea di Roma before the physical mobility. The exact date will be communicated by the international relations office to the student's e-mail account.

Students will proceed to read and sign the documents requested by the Erasmus+ programme, following at all times the instructions provided by the international relations office and published on the UER website (financial agreement, learning agreement, certificate of stay...).

## 8. STUDENT RESPONSIBILITIES

A) Students will be responsible for finding and booking their accommodation and for managing the documentation required by the BIP - Erasmus+ exchange programme.

B) Students will be obliged to attend the pre-departure meeting.

D) Students will contact the coordinator of the programme at UER (Prof. Aniello Merone [aniello.merone@unier.it](mailto:aniello.merone@unier.it)) in order to manage their learning agreement prior to the programme. This agreement will define that UER is subject to recognize, once the BIP course has been successfully completed and passed, the student participation with a teaching load of 3 ECTS. The template will be sent directly to the student's e-mail account.

E) Students must complete all official documents of the Erasmus+ programme, following the indications provided by the international relations office. The documents template will be sent directly to the student's e-mail account.

F) They will obtain a European health insurance card or private health insurance covering the entire duration of the physical stay in Lublin - Poland (hosting country).

Failure to comply with the terms and conditions of the call for applications as well as the concealment of data, failure to submit documents, lack of acceptance, alteration or manipulation may be grounds for rejection or cancellation from the exchange programme.
