CALL FOR PARTICIPATION IN THE BIP (BLENDED INTENSIVE PROGRAMME) "ROME AT THE ORIGINS OF EUROPE THE LEGACY OF A MULTILAYERED CITY SHARED BY DIFFERENT COMMUNITIES" — FOR STUDENTS OF THE BACHELOR'S DEGREE IN TOURISM

1. PURPOSE

The purpose of this call for applications is to define the conditions under which students of Università Europea di Roma may participate in the BIP (Blended Intensive Program) "Rome at the origins of Europe—The legacy of a multilayered city shared by different communities" mobility programme, which is among the novelties of the Erasmus+ Programme, with the aim of combining physical mobility with virtual and distance activities.

In this way, students from different European universities receive an educational experience through telematic collaboration between academic institutions, culminating in a short mobility at one of the partner universities.

This exchange will be carried out with the aim of academic recognition and achievement, as well as of matching the student's curricular profile.

Università Europea di Roma is pleased to host the project and welcome students from Universidad Católica San Antonio de Murcia, Universidad de Murcia, Universidad Católica de Valencia (Spain), Apor Vilmos Catholic College (Hungary), Catholic University of Croatia (Croatia) and Cardinal Stefan Wyszyński University, Warsaw (Poland).

Everything that is not regulated by these terms and conditions will be governed by the European provisions for the Erasmus+ Programme and the General Mobility Regulations of Università Europea di Roma.

2. ELIGIBILITY REQUIREMENTS

The eligibility requirements for participating in the project will be the following:

- Being enrolled in the Bachelor's degree in Tourism at Università Europea di Roma, during the academic year 2024/2025
- Proving knowledge of English at level B2 of the Common European Framework of Reference (CEFR)

3. PLACES OFFERED AND DURATION PERIOD

4 places are offered to participate in the BIP (Blended Intensive Program) "Rome at the origins of Europe—The legacy of a multilayered city shared by different communities".

The structure of the programme is attached in Annex I of this call. It is integrated in the academic calendar 2024/2025 as follows:

- 4 13 weeks of online training between February 3rd and May 9th 2025.
- **4** 6 days of face-to-face training at Università Europea di Roma from April 7th to 12th, 2025.



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4. SUBMISSION OF APPLICATIONS

Candidates must submit their application exclusively through the application form available on the UER website <u>here</u> and submit it by **January 30**th **2025**:

- a) by hand delivery to the International Relations Office (1st floor, room C108), during reception hours.
- b) by e-mail to elena.lecci@unier.it.

The application must be accompanied by:

- a curriculum vitae in English
- a self-certification of enrolment with the updated status of student's career extracted from the Esse3 system: the list of taken examinations, relative marks and ECTS acquired
- copy of a valid identity document
- valid English B2 certification

Application received after the deadline, incomplete or incorrect, will not be taken into consideration.

The list of successful candidates will be evaluated by an appointed commission and published on the UER website within **January 31**st **2025**.

<u>By February 3rd, 2025</u> the successful candidates must send a statement confirming their participation in the BIP by e-mail to <u>elena.lecci@unier.it</u>.

Candidates who do not wish to participate in the BIP project have to send an e-mail to the same address within the above-mentioned deadline.

5. SELECTION CRITERIA AND RANKINGS

Eligible applications will be evaluated according to the following criteria:

- up to 60/100 based on the sum of the weighted average and the percentage of the total credits accumulated in relation to the semester (obtained credits ÷ credits to be obtained, within the semester of reference for each student, x 30)
- up to 10/100 for the level of knowledge of the English language, awarded as follows: 3/100 for level B2, 6/100 for level C1, 10/100 for level C2.

6. RECOGNITION

Upon completion of the activities under both components of the BIP project (both virtual and on-campus), UER will award the participating students 3 ECTS, which will be included in their careers as part of the *Etica*, *territorio* e sviluppo sostenibile UER exam.
